We own two mobile barrier trailers and have required a total routine maintenance contractor to purchase one for their short term work. As a result of their use of the trailer on our project, the contractor told me they purchased one on their own for another project they have in another area. The roadway crews in some areas will not work without it in place, and we have had to keep the crews from coming in earlier and earlier to "borrow" it from other crews so they have it for the day.

We also just purchased (received it last week) a remote control mower to allow our operator to stay in a safe place while mowing alongside the roadway in unprotected areas and steep slopes.
